CHANGING MINDS AND HEARTS

Next weekend marks the 50th Anniversary in the UK of the passing into law of Medical Termination of the Pregnancy Bill of 27th October 1967. In 2015 alone, there were 185,824 abortions in England and 12,134 in Wales. Greater access to abortion is hailed by some as liberation. For those who uphold the dignity of human life from conception, it is a tragedy. Anyone who has faced the situation personally knows the dilemma created by news of a pregnancy that is unplanned and unwanted. The pressure to have an abortion may have felt immense. Little practical support may have been on offer with no sense of visible alternatives. St. John Paul II wrote many years ago:

"The Church is aware of the many factors which may have influenced your decision, and she does not doubt that in many cases it was a painful and even shattering decision"

The voice of those wounded by abortion are critical for our understanding. The Church's Ministry of pastoral care, healing and forgiveness is vital. As a Church, we remain committed to protecting every human life, including when the other is the minutest of our sisters and brothers. On this 50th Anni of the Abortion Act in England, Pope Francis reminds us of what is at stake:



"All life has inestimable value, even the weakest and most vulnerable, the sick, the old, the unborn and the poor are masterpieces of God's creation, made in His own image, destined to live forever and deserving of the utmost reverence and respect".
