ÉIGSE NA BRÍDEOIGE 1, 2<sup>ND</sup>, 3<sup>RD</sup> FEBRUARY 2019- This annual cultural festival will be holding the 27<sup>th</sup> Éigse festival in February 2019 in venues throughout the Gaeltacht villages of Uíbh Ráthach Co Kerry – Cathair Dónal, An Dromod, Baile 'n Sceilg, An Coireán (Waterville) and An Gleann.

The Éigse is bi-lingual with a headphone simultaneous translation for Irish language events. Migration will be a central theme of Éigse 2019 – a topic which is very relevant to Iveragh as it is to all of rural Ireland at the moment. The population of Iveragh continues to drop and the ratio of elderly/young people continues to get bigger. The Éigse will be addressing these issues from a historical perspective and attempting to identify solutions - particularly looking at inward migration as a means of combating the problem and enriching the social structure of one of the most strikingly beautiful areas in the country.
