MASS AT HOME - KINDLY SPREAD THE WORD:

- We are blessed in the parish to have the Parish Radio and the
Webcam on www.killarneyparish.com
- Radio Kerry on Sunday morning during the Horizons religious
programme at 9am (Mass will be at 9.30am).
- RTE Mass is now being broadcast on the 'News Now' channel
21 on Saorview - that's on weekdays at 10.30am. On Sunday
mornings tv RTE 1 11am they have either Mass or Christian
worship prayer.
- EWTN Catholic religious station for broadcast Masses and
prayers.
- Radio Maria Ireland Saorview channel 210 - a lovely station of
Mass, Rosary, prayers and conversations on religious topics.

But even without those channels and stations, remember the power of
your own prayer at home, read the prayers in your own prayerbook or
Sunday Missal, pray the psalms in the Divine Office Prayer of the
Church, open your own Bible at home, pray the Rosary yourself (or
better still as a family at home). Always know that in prayer we are
united with God, and with Christians and people of faith throughout the
world.

MESSAGE FROM BISHOP RAY

Turn to Our Lady, Queen of Peace for strength and peace.

With Covid-19 many people will find this May
upsetting and distressing. Prayer to Our Lady each day
can be a source of calm, hope and resilience. She will
bring your prayer to the ear of the Lord Jesus.

When Our Lady appeared in Knock in August 1879 poverty and
disease was common in Ireland. In the years since, Knock has always
been a place of comfort and hope for Irish people in need. Lourdes has
always been a special place of peace and hope for the sick. The sick,
the bereaved and the troubled have always turned to Our Lady.

Pope Francis issued a letter to the world for the month of May. He
writes: "I want to encourage everyone to rediscover the beauty of
praying the Rosary at home in the month of May. . . . I keep all of you in
my prayers, especially those suffering most greatly, and I ask you,
please, to pray for me. I thank you, and with great affection, I send you
my blessing". Some people like to join with others praying the Rosary.
An Irish radio station, Radio Maria, prays the Rosary each night at 9pm.
Pope Francis has also written a prayer that he asks us to pray at the
end of the Rosary and he himself will pray it too during the month of
May 'in spiritual union with all of you'.

**You shine continuously on our journey
as a sign of salvation and hope.**

**We entrust ourselves to you, Health of the Sick,
who, at the foot of the cross,
were united with Jesus' suffering,
and persevered in your faith.**
