THOUGHT ON THIS WEEKENDS GOSPEL:

Jesus Always Gives Us Better Than What We Ask For: They are asking for more ordinary bread. Jesus promises them something better—bread to feed the spirit. He starts by talking about ordinary things and then elevates the conversation to more spiritual things. We are well aware how much we need certain everyday things, like bread. Jesus is trying to help us see we need something to feed us spiritually just as much—if not more. The crowd ate yesterday and was satisfied yesterday. Today, they are hungry again, and come again to Jesus hoping to be given something like manna that will feed them every day, so they won't have to worry about ordinary hunger again. Jesus goes beyond that and speaks to them of a bread that is coming, a bread that will feed them spiritually so that they will never have to hunger spiritually again. He gives them something far better than what they ask for: the bread of his own body.

Our Lady's Well, Millstreet

Otherwise known as 'Tubrid Well' has been a place of pilgrimage for the people of Dunhallow for countless generations. In Pagan times ancestors came to worship the waters of the same Well two thousand years ago. It is forty feet in diameter and is said to be the second largest well in Britain and Ireland. Vast improvements have taken place over the last sixty years. In the Month of May many people travel to the well to 'do the rounds'. People come to say the rosary and to drink the healing waters. Various healings have been attributed to the well including a cripple walks again, an eight-year old child begins to talk, a woman has her fingers straightened and a priest has a speech-impediment cured.
