SACRED SPACE - PLACES OF PRAYER IN KERRY DIOCESE:

We now have a new Sacred Space in the Cathedral for the Month of July. Since we are unable to travel long distances on pilgrimages at this time due to current restrictions this space invites us to reflect and pray at the local sites in our own Diocese. From these images we see the rich tradition and history of Christianity in the Diocese of Kerry. Over the next few weeks it may be possible for you to visit some of these beautiful and holy places which have been a source of inspiration, prayer and pilgrimage for generations. Over the next few weeks we will take time to reflect on this sacred places and the impact they have had for the people of Kerry Diocese and beyond. This week we will reflect on Ardfert Cathedral and Skellig Michael.

Ardfert Cathedral:

The Diocese of Kerry was formerly known as the Diocese of Ardfert and Aghadoe with Ardfert Cathedral being its Ecclesial Chair. The Ardfert Cathedral that we see today dates from the 11th century, however, as with many buildings of this age it has undergone substantial changes over the centuries. One of the gems of the site is the Romanesque style west doorway, part of an earlier church constructed in the mid-12th century and incorporated into the later building.

Skellig Michael:

Is found eight and a half miles off the coast of South Kerry. It is one of our most precious and inspiring places of Christian heritage, remaining as it does in an 'in-between-place' between earth and heaven, between land and the great deep, between worldly concerns and those of the Spirit. In the Irish Annals, Skellig is referred to as a place of retreat and refuge from the fifth century. Monks lived, studied and worked on the island for centuries.
