

BIODIVERSITY

The 'Web of Life': all that supports our very existence on earth

- Cultivate hope as you garden: in your own/your parish/community garden
- Get to know what's in that garden/your local area:
 - grass, plants, hedges, shrubs, trees, stream/river
 - insects, birds and other creatures
 - walls, stones, ditches, shady corners
- What could you protect?

'St Francis asked that part of the friary garden always be left untouched, so that wild flowers and herbs could grow there, and those who saw them could raise their minds to God, the Creator of such beauty.' (Laudato Si', 12)

- What could you add?
 - Be wise: Reduce mowing and avoid (or try to avoid) using herbicides/pesticides
 - A log pile a home for other creatures
 - A small pond for aquatic creatures
 - A pile of leaves/A bird feeder
 - Pollinator-friendly plants:

PERSONAL

- Always carry your keep cup/refill bottle
- Conserve and reduce energy and water use

- Use a local refill shop



PARISH

- Plan to avoid single use plastic
