BISHOP RAY MARKING THE CENTENARY OF THE LEGION OF MARY

The Legion of Mary is celebrating its centenary. Monday September 7th, 2021, marks exactly one hundred years since Frank Duff and his first associates held the first ever meeting. Congratulations, thank you, and every blessing on all Legionaries in our diocese and worldwide.

The Legion has always insisted it is parish based. It strives to promote prayer and devotion to Our Lady, and to encourage people to put faith at the centre of their lives.

In the past many parishes in our dioceses had a strong Praesidium. This is a good time to remember this local history. In recent decades the Legion has not been very strong in Ireland. As our diocese transitions to a greater reliance on lay ministry, may the Legion of Mary enjoy a new springtime among us.

In contrast, the Legion has gone from strength to strength in many countries worldwide, - it is present in 170 countries with 'several million' members. Truly it has been a great gift from Ireland to the world. Its central organisation continues to be based in Ireland. Three names stand out as regards the Legion, many hope they will one day be recognised as saints:

Frank Duff	1899 – 1980	
Edel Quinn	1907 – 1944	Died on mission in Kenya
Alfie Lamb	1932 – 1959	Died on mission in Argentina

All past legionaries fondly remember the Legion of Mary handbook and the Legion Prayer. Both continue to be regarded as 'invariable', - 100% unchanged in every country.
