

Remembering Our Dead November Masses & Evening prayer

Tuesday 2nd November is the Feast of All Souls. Mass for Feast of All Souls will be celebrated in Glencar at 6:00 p.m. and in Glenbeigh at 7:30 pm. .

Mass for the Holy Souls and those remembered on the All Souls Lists, will be celebrated in Glenbeigh on Tuesday 2nd November and on the Monday evenings of the month of November. 8th./15th/22nd /29th. All these Masses will be celebrated at 7:30 p.m.

Masses for the Holy Souls and those remembered on the All Souls Lists in Glencar will be celebrated at 6 p.m. on Tuesday 2nd November and on the Saturday evenings of the 7th/14th./21st./28th. November.

At the Mass on Monday 29th November all those who died since last November will be especially remembered. A candle in their memory will be brought to the sanctuary and placed on a table before the Altar during the Mass.

Please Collect your November Envelope at the back of the Church and return it in time for these celebrations.

Parishioners who suffered a bereavement of an immediate family member who died outside the parish (Father, Mother, Brother, Sister,) since last November can have them remembered in Mass of the 29th. November; a candle in their memory will be brought to the sanctuary and placed on the table before the Altar during the Mass.

These parishioners are asked to submit the name of the immediate family member they want to be remembered, their date of death and the name of the parish in which they lived, **by Thursday 18th. November,** to the Parish Office.

I ask all Clubs and Organisations not to have their events clash with these November Masses for our dead; and the Saturday Evening Mass in Glencar and Sunday Morning Mass in Glenbeigh at any time . Thank You.

Seeing Your Life Through The Lens Of The Gospel. Mk 10:17-30

1. We often get satisfaction from the things we own, clothes, cars, homes, gadgets, or money. There would be something unnatural if we did not. But what happens to us when our possessions begin to 'own' us, when they take a hold of us, when we become obsessed with them? Jesus seeks followers who have the freedom to let go of possessions in order to be a servant of others. In whom have you seen this freedom? When have you experienced it yourself?

2. Growth implies change. That change sometimes means letting go of something we have at this moment: job, status, home, security, or something else we value. There can be an apparent loss in letting go. Yet have you ever found that you gained by having the freedom to let go of something to which you had previously clung?

3. The disciples thought that Jesus was making impossible demands of people following him. He acknowledged that discipleship was impossible to us on our own efforts alone. How have you experienced the benefits of the help of others and of God when you were faced with difficulties in life?
