3rd July 2022

I am sending you out....

The gospel this weekend is about Jesus sending out his followers into mission. And you would think that his pep talk would be one that would encourage them and to fill them with hope and enthusiasm.

Not so! "The harvest is rich but the labourers are few". "I am sending you out like lambs amongst wolves." "Carry no purse, no haversack, no sandals".

This task sounds uninviting: It is too big for us; we are likely to get ravaged by wolves, and we can't take anything with us to help us on the way!!

So what is Jesus telling us about the task he entrusts to us and every generation of followers?

The task is not about what we can achieve. It is what God can achieve through us. It is overwhelming for us but with God's spirit in us, he can achieve wonderful results. It is a call to partnership in building the kingdom of God and we all have a part to play in that. It calls for both faith and humility.

He is reminding us to be completely focussed on the task at hand. "Salute no one on the road" is not a directive to be rude! Jesus is telling us not to become side-tracked but keep our eye on the ball and not lose sight of what we need to be doing.

Our mission is about active engagement. We see pain, suffering and hardship all around us today. So much that is not part of God's plan.

But there are also signs of God's kingdom in our midst. "The kingdom of God is close to you". Hospitality and acceptance of difference are key to God's kingdom. Caring for the sick and the dying, the sad, the lonely, the hurt and the anxious, are all signs of the Kingdom of God in our midst.

Proclaiming the Kingdom, clearly in words, is an important aspect of mission too. People cannot guess the truths of the Christian faith. They need to be told about Jesus' love and how that has been expressed through the Cross and Resurrection.

So, this fascinating passage of the gospel has much to tell us about mission. Our mission.
