Palm Sunday is the beginning of Holy Week, when we celebrate Jesus' triumphant into entry Jerusalem. We hear how the crowds spread their garments on the road before Him and cut branches from palm trees and went to meet Him crying 'Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord!' Sadly these are the same people who called to 'crucify him' on Good Friday. It shows the fickleness of the mob. Jesus' final days are marked with betrayal, denial and finally crucifixion and death. The second reading from St. Paul helps us to understand the First Reading and the Gospel. Jesus chose to suffer for us. He chose to die for all of us because He loves us. The First Reading from Isaiah Jesus' foretells suffering. The suffering servant who suffers in carrying out his mission and is sustained by the firm faith that God will not abandon him. That suffering and death only take on their full meaning in the Resurrection and to understand the Resurrection we must reflect deeply on Christ's suffering and death. Through His crucifixion and death, Jesus absorbed all our sins, the violence and ugliness of human sinfulness and transformed into forgiveness and Love. It is awesome! This is the victory of love over evil. If we link our sufferings to those of Christ they become a source of blessing. Lord, help us to walk with you during this Holy Week and see the depth of Your love for us so that we can become holy ourselves.
