Through the Locked Doors

It is one week after the resurrection and the disciples are in the same place they were Easter night. They are in the same room behind the same locked room. So if the resurrection is such a life changing event, why are they still in the same place? What difference has the empty tomb made? It doesn't look as if has made much of a difference to them.

I wonder, one week after Easter, what has Christ's resurrection done for us? Is your life different? What difference has the empty tomb made in your life over the last week? Why am I in the same place? I should be living the resurrection better, more powerfully, more fully, more authentically, than what I am.

Resurrection takes time. It is not a one-time event. It's something that we grow into. It is a way of being. By the grace of God we evolve into resurrected people. Do you know the end of Thomas' story? Thomas brought the gospel of Christ to India. He died a martyr and is revered in India. That sounds like someone who grew and changed, someone for whom the resurrection of Christ was real, someone for whom the empty tomb made a difference. It just took a little time, as it does for most, perhaps all of us.

We know that Thomas doubted the resurrection of Christ. His disbelief is just Thomas' starting place. It is neither good nor bad. It is a starting place. What is your starting place? Whatever your life is today, that is the starting point for your story of resurrection.

So if you are dealing with deep loneliness, sorrow, and loss, that's your starting point. That is the room which Christ enters. If you are locked in a house of fear, confusion, or darkness, that's your starting point and the place in which Jesus stands. If illness, old age, disability, or uncertainty are facts of your life, that is your starting point and the place in which Jesus shows up. If you feel lost, betrayed, disappointed, overwhelmed, that's your starting point and the house Jesus enters. If joy, gratitude, and celebration are the facts of your life today, that is the starting point for your story of resurrection.

He steps into the midst of our house, through the locked doors, and breathes peace and life into us. He breathes peace and hope into us. He breathes peace and courage into us. He breathes peace and strength into us. And that breath of peace is the key that unlocks the door. Let it give you the hope, courage, and strength to unlock and open the doors of your life, and then step forth and out of the house. Rivers do not drink their own water; trees do not eat their own fruit; the sun does not shine on itself and flowers do not spread their fragrance for themselves.
