A NOTE FROM FR JIM.

'I have told you this so that my own joy may be in you and your joy be complete.' John 15:11. The English comedian Jimmy Carr (Normally not my cup of tea when it comes to humour) made a few very interesting comments on a podcast recently. He mentioned hot showers. Hot showers are available to most of the earth's inhabitants in these times. Yet only the elite enjoyed such luxuries a hundred years ago. He said of all the 117 billion people that ever walked this planet in the last two hundred thousand years we the people of the west today have it better than all who came before us.
