Saint Peter: c. 1–c. 64
Patron Saint of Rome, bakers, brickmakers, masons, bridge-builders, butchers, clockmakers, cobblers, fishermen, harvesters, watchmakers, locksmiths, netmakers, the papacy.

Invoked against feet problems and fevers.



Saint Paul: c. 3–c. 64
Patron Saint of Rome,
evangelists, theologians,
musicians, public relations
personnel, writers, publishers,
and reporters; rope-, saddle-,
and tentmakers.

Invoked against snakes and hailstorms.

Celebrating Saints

Saints Peter and Paul, The Apostles

Saint Peter (born Shimon Bar Yonah; also known as Peter the Apostle, Simon Peter, Simeon, Simon, or Cephas, was one of the Twelve Apostles of Jesus and one of the first leaders of the early Christian Church. He appears repeatedly and prominently in all four New Testaments.

Catholic and Orthodox tradition treats Peter as the first bishop of Rome or pope. He was later given by Jesus the name *Cephas* from the Aramaic *Kepha*, 'rock/stone'. In the vast majority of mentions in the New Testament, he is called *Petros*, from the Greek and Latin word for a rock or stone (*petra*), to which the masculine ending was added, rendered into English as *Peter*.[[]

Saint Paul, also named Saul of Tarsus commonly known as Paul the Apostle was a Christian apostle who spread the teachings of Jesus in the first-century world. For his contributions towards the New Testament, he is generally regarded as one of the most important figures of the Apostolic Age, and he also founded several Christian communities in Asia Minor and Europe from the mid-40s to the mid-50s AD.

Approximately half of the Acts of the Apostles document St Paul's travels, preaching and miracles. Paul was not one of the Twelve Apostles, and did not know Jesus during his lifetime. Paul lived as a Pharisee and participated in the persecution of early disciples of Jesus before his conversion. On his way to arrest Christians in Damascus, Paul saw a bright light, heard Christ speak, was blinded, and later healed by Ananias. Paul was then baptized. He made three missionary journeys to spread the Christian message to non-Jewish communities. Fourteen of the 27 books in the New Testament have traditionally been attributed to Paul.
