The Language of Silence

Two huge obstacles to growing in faith are noise and haste. And we live in a world where both appear to dominate. When was the last time we entered our homes in the evening and did not put on the television or radio within five minutes? Or we put away our devices – mobile phone and tablet – for three hours so that we could enjoy some peace and quiet?

And the pace of life has virtually overtaken us. We have to keep moving faster and faster, it seems, even to stand still.

Today's gospel calls us in the opposite direction. The image of Mary sitting at the feet of Jesus is an invitation to silence and stillness. If we want to be in relationship with Jesus, we have to stop rushing about and slow down, at least sometimes, in order that he may have the chance to reach us. If we want to listen to the voice of God, we need to learn the language of silence.

Of course, much of the time, we cannot avoid the noise and activity. It is an inevitable part of life today. But if we want to live life at a level that is deeper than the surface urgencies of each day, we must create spaces of silence and stillness. Most of us, most of the time, live Martha-like lives, busy about many things that are urgent but not of ultimate importance. Today we can learn from Mary and redress the balance by trying to carve out periods of silence that enable us to tune in to what really matters.
