

#### Week beginning 20th July 2025 16th Sunday in Ordinary Time C



Today, the 16th Sunday in ordinary time, the Bible Readings tell us of the importance of the presence of God in our lives, putting Him first else above all by having relationship with his Son Jesus Christ.
