Indifference

"The opposite of love is not hate,
it's indifference.
The opposite of art is not ugliness,
it's indifference.
The opposite of faith is not heresy,
it's indifference.
And the opposite of life is not death,
it's indifference."
(Elie Wiesel)

The sin of the rich man in the Gospel is not so much that he is rich or that he eats very well. His sin is that of indifference; he is unmoved. The path of holiness, the path to eternal life is one of attentiveness to the one who is in need.

Pope Francis reminded us that this is an age in which we have become indifferent as a society. We are indifferent to the environment, to climate change and it's negative impact on poorer countries; we are indifferent to the trafficking of women and children and other forms of modern enslavement. Our society is growing increasingly indifferent to God.

For Pope Francis the solution to indifference is mercy – mercy in the sense of developing that innate instinct of reaching out to do the right thing at the right time. Reaching out to feed the poor, clothe the naked, house the homeless, represent the voiceless.

All too often, Lord, we turn away from the world's many problems, which seem too big, too complex, or too far away.
Forgive us our indifference.

It is easier, Lord, to see only what is around us: our lives, our homes, our challenges. Forgive us our isolation.

Help us to see with your eyes: eyes which notice one another and help us understand.

Help us to dream your dream: of communities that reach out and dialogue and where diverse people creatively cooperate.

Help us to be people of solidarity and action, so moved by prayer, encounter, and understanding that peace can become a reality. Amen.

Our hearts are heavy as we witness lives torn apart, as we see the faces of frightened children and hear the pleas of those without water or food.
