A NOTE FROM FR. JIM.....

In my 28 years as a priest this is only the fourth time that the 14th of September falls on a Sunday which to my delight allow us to celebrate this wonderful feast day called the Feast of the Triumph of the Cross (also known as the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, celebrated on September 14th). It calls us to contemplate how the instrument of Christ's suffering has become the symbol of His victory—over sin, death, and despair. Instead of retreating from a gruesome symbol, we are invited to embrace the Cross as an icon of hope. It represents God's willingness to enter human brokenness, transform it through love, and elevate it toward eternal life. As we adore the Cross, we remember that suffering finds its meaning not in itself, but in the redemptive power poured out through sacrificial love. Today we remember all who are carrying their own crosses especially those who are sick at this time. May they unite their pains, their suffering their crosses to the victorious Cross of Jesus Christ and may all who suffer live in hope in knowing that they'll eventually share in Christ's victory over all evil.
