#### A NOTE FROM FR. JIM.....

During the week I had a flashback of my late mother sharing an experience she had during a day out at the Tralee Races sometime during the 1980's. On the way to the races with my dad she stopped off in a drapery shop to purchase a rain jacket due to the uncertain weather forecast. She purchased a light rain jacket for £15. She handed in £20 and received the change back wrapped in the receipt and she quickly placed it into her purse. It was only later at the races when she unravelled the receipt that she noticed the change was £35. Obviously the poor woman in the shop thought she received a £50. My mother called into the shop the following morning where the shop keeper in total relief burst into tears. She called my mother an honest woman. Jesus said to his disciples in today's Gospel: 'The man who can be trusted in little things can be trusted in great; the man who is dishonest in little things will be dishonest in great. That experience that my mother shared served as a great lesson for me personally. As a Chinese proverb goes — If the top beam is not straight, the lower beams will be crooked. Where this is true for parenting, it's also true for government and those in power. St. Paul in today's second reading encourages us to pray for our civil leaders and pray that they will be moral and ethical people who set an example for their people. We're asked also to pray that they will allow the Christian church to flourish and grow and be allowed to practice their faith without persecution or ridicule. May our government see the great connection between a God fearing people and a loving and peaceful society.
