**NORM FOR THE INDULGENCESS AT THE COMMEMORATION OF ALL SOULS.**

1. From twelve o’clock noon on 1st November until midnight on 2nd November, all who confessed, received Holy Communion and prayed for pope’s intentions (one Our Father and Hail Mary, or any other prayer of ones choice) can gain one plenary indulgence by visiting a church or oratory, and there reciting one Our Father and the Apostle’s Creed. This indulgence is applicable only to the souls of the departed  
Confession may be made any time within the week preceding or the week following November.
2. The faithful who visit a cemetery and pray for the dead may gain a plenary indulgence applicable only to th Holy Souls on the usual conditions once per day from 1st to 8th November.
