Today is the thirtieth Sunday in ordinary time. The readings from Holy Scripture show the contrast between pride and humility. In the first reading from Sirach, 'The Lord hears the cry of the oppressed '. In the Psalm 'The Lord hears the cry of the poor' and St. Paul tells us He has lived his life in dependence and hope in the Lord. In the Gospel Jesus teaches us how we should come before God to pray. We are familiar with the story of the Pharisee and the tax collector who went to the temple to pray. The Pharisee focused on himself and his own righteousness, he was full of pride and not aware of his own sinfulness. It was important to him to look good to others and to be seen outwardly doing good. But God's mercy only comes to us when we repent and acknowledge our sinfulness .The lord looks at our hearts and looks for sincerity and humility. The tax

collector was humble and honest in his prayer and Jesus commended him for it. Ultimately we need God to transform us; to fill our hearts with love for him and neighbour. It can be difficult to let go because of our ego and pride and admit our sinfulness and our total dependence on God but if we go to him empty handed he can fill us with his love and recreating us to his own image and likeness and preparing us for eternal life with him in heaven.
