Missionaries of Hope Among all Peoples

Before his passing in April, Pope Francis issued a special message for World Mission Day 2025, entitled Missionaries of Hope Among All Peoples." In it, he reminded every Christian and the whole community of the baptized of "our fundamental vocation to be, in the footsteps of Christ, messengers and builders of hope."

He emphasized that mission is not just for a few but for all, urging believers to bring light to a world in need through prayer, witness, and acts of solidarity. Hope is shared through presence, compassion, and commitment to building a more just and fraternal world.

During Jesus' earthly ministry, He brought healing and consolation to the needy and afflicted. Through His disciples, Jesus continues this mission, reaching out to the poor, afflicted, despairing, and oppressed, offering them the "balm of consolation and the wine of hope."

We are all called to share the Good News by engaging with the real-life struggles of those we encounter, thereby becoming bearers and builders of hope. The importance of empathy is stressed, "the joys and hopes, the grief and anguish of the people of our time... are the joys and hopes, the grief and anguish of the followers of Christ as well."

Prayer is our primary missionary activity. By praying we keep alive the spark of hope lit by God within us, so that it can become a great fire, which enlightens and warms everyone around us, also by those concrete actions and gestures that prayer itself inspires.

World Mission Sunday is our chance to show love and solidarity to our brothers and sisters overseas. In offering our prayers, we join with missionaries everywhere in communion and compassion to support them in spreading the Good News, and by giving a donation we respond to Christ's call to feed the hungry and clothe the naked.

The collection taken up on this Sunday supports:

- The formation of seminarians and future religious sisters and brothers
- The education of children in Catholic schools
- Healthcare and pastoral care in remote and underserved regions
- The training of catechists and lay leaders
- The construction of churches, chapels, schools and mission centres

When we give, we are not simply making a donation - we are participating in a spiritual and missionary act of love, sustaining the Church where it cannot yet sustain itself.

Prayer for Missionaries

Lord, sent by the Father, You are the first Missionary. We thank You for calling us to participate in Your mission, which is the holiest duty of the Church. We thank you for our Baptism, in which You made us partakers of Your own Divine Life. We thank you for the Eucharist, in which You give us Yourself as food to nourish and sustain us. We thank you for the gift of Confirmation in which You empowered us to become committed witnesses to Your love and to your truth. Help us. Lord. to be missionaries wherever we are.

Teach us to see You in our brothers and sisters regardless of race or language.

Help us to live our lives in such a way that our actions and words proclaim You as Christ, the Lord.

Bless in special way those missionaries who have given their lives to You, to serve You in difficult and often dangerous situations.

Keep them safe, holy and enthusiastic as they spread the Gospel even to the ends of the earth. Amen.
