A NOTE FROM FR. JIM....

During the week I had five days on retreat. Lovely spending time with my fellow priests in lovely surroundings and listening to wonderful talks given by Fr. Billy Swan. Fr. Billy focused on the reality of change in a priests life. Indeed it was very real for him since he has been asked to leave his parish in Wexford to take up a position in the Vatican in the next two weeks. He shared the pain of his own experience but also discussed the pain of his fellow priests who've retired recently and struggled with feelings of being now irrelevant and forgotten. And the Catholic Church itself once the centre of society now just barely tolerated at the margins. I found it interesting then when I opened the readings for this weekend's mass that speak about the 'End Times' or what we call the 'Apocalypse' which we sometimes miss understand as destruction and upheaval but rather it means 'Unveiling' or 'Revelation'. Certainly there are times when God's wonderful plan for us is revealed that it can be in our minds at least a great disaster and a great upheaval especially when we're spiritually asleep, day dreaming that our wonderful cozy lives will stay this way forever. Fr. Billy spoke about embracing change and to see it as a great opportunity to be part of God's great adventure and he reassured us that once we surrender in prayer to God and the power of His Cross great things will happen. In today's Gospel Jesus unveils the future of the magnificent Temple in Jerusalem. How it will be completely levelled. For the disciples this was the end of the world because the Temple was everything to the Jewish people. But Jesus had a better Temple in mind His own body the 'Church'. So for all of us we must never fear change and upheaval in our lives. It's not the end of the world once we're united to Jesus and His divine plan of love. We must remain faithful in prayer and as Jesus said to His disciples' - Your endurance will win you your lives.'
