A NOTE FROM FR. JIM.....

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica, the cathedral church of the Bishop of Rome — the Holy Father. This feast takes precedence over the 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time because the Lateran Basilica holds a special place in the life of the Church. Known as the "Mother and Head of all the Churches in the City and in the World," the Basilica of St. John Lateran houses the Cathedra, or chair, of the Bishop of Rome — a sign of the Pope's teaching authority and pastoral care for the universal Church. In Catholic life, church buildings are rich in symbolism. They are not merely made of stone and wood, but are visible signs of the living Church, built of "living stones" — the People of God, united in Christ. Every consecrated church is a sacred space where God has pitched His tent among us (cf. John 1:14), a dwelling place of His presence and grace. As Canon Law reminds us (Can. 1210): "Only those things which serve to exercise or promote worship, piety, and religion are permitted in a sacred place; anything out of harmony with the holiness of the place is forbidden." Let us always approach our churches with reverence and respect, never as mere venues for secular concerns, but as places that lift our hearts and minds to God.
