THE LENTEN SEASON

This season is a time of preparation for Easter through fasting, prayer and almsgiving.

LITURGICAL REMINDERS

- No Gloria or Alleluia are sung/said during Lent. The Gospel acclamation changes e.g. Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ, King of eternal glory.
- The sanctuary is not decorated during the season of Lent – the next time we see flowers in the church is on Holy Thursday for the Feast of the Lord’s Supper.

LITURGY OF THE WORD

Readings

- **First Reading:** Gn 2:7-9; 3:1-7
- **Psalm:** Ps 50:3-6; 12-14, 17 – Have mercy on us, O Lord, for we have sinned.
- **Second Reading:** Rm: 5:12- 19
- **Gospel:** Mt: 4: 1-11

Homily Notes

The Gospel centres around the temptations of Jesus in the desert to choose another direction in life. We can be attracted by choices in life, but we must ask what is my goal in life? Where do I get true nourishment from?

Prayer of the Faithful – suggested text

1. That **the Church** and all its members may be led by the Holy Spirit into a deeper relationship with God this Lent. Lord, hear us.
2. That **those who are struggling** with despair, addiction or isolation may find strength and encouragement. Lord, hear us.
3. For **the Pope’s intention** for this month that the sick, especially children and their families may receive the necessary medical care and support, never losing strength or hope. Lord, hear us.
4. That **those who have died** in the peace of Christ and who put their trust in him may rejoice in God’s presence with the angels and the saints. Lord, hear us.
