In under a fortnight's time, the Easter Triduum will begin, on Holy Thursday evening, 2nd of April. During the Triduum, each of us recalls the great events that Easter remembers. We ask God's help in the last days of Lent.

Vocations: We continue to pray for vocations to the Priesthood. Lets put the question out there to someone we might feel has a Religious vocation. Did you ever consider becoming a Priest?

Penitential preparation prepare ourselves for this celebration and our participation in it, let us call to mind our sins. let us call to mind our need of divine assistance (pause):enced in our lives and call to mind the times we failed to show love.

Penitential Rite

To prepare ourselves to hear God's word today, let us call to mind our need of divine assistance (pause):

You raise the dead to life in the Spirit: Lord, have mercy.

You bring pardon and peace to the sinner: Lord, have mercy.

You bring light to those in darkness: Lord, have mercy.

Prayer

Merciful God, you showed your glory to our fallen race by sending your Son to confound the powers of death. Call us forth from sin's dark tomb. Break the bonds which hold us, that we may believe and proclaim Christ, the cause of our freedom and the source of life, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of he Holy Spirit God for ever and ever.

Introduction to the Scripture Readings

The three readings today focus on the question: *'How do we obtain life?'*
Ezekiel 37: 12-14 — Ezekiel says that those committed to God will find life after they die.

Romans 8:8-11 — Paul says that through the Spirit we can find life.

John 11: 1-45 — The Gospel describes the raising of Lazarus and shows that all God's power is found in Jesus, who brings believ-

Martha and Mary were struggling to come to terms with their bereavement. What has helped you in similar situations?

The concern of Jesus is palpable and touching. Recall those who matter to you and to whom you matter. Such love mediates God's love, which surpasses human love with the gift of new life and Easter joy.

One can imagine Lazarus as a symbol of people and groups that are written off as dead (sometimes by themselves), and yet through faith come back to life again. Have you had the experience of being revived by faith? Has faith helped to free you from what held you in bondage, or was destructive of your life
