On this the Third Sunday of Easter, the Gospel shows us the disciples returning to their  
everyday work, unsure and a little lost. It is there, in an ordinary moment, that Jesus comes  
to them. At first they do not recognise Him, but soon they see that He has been with them all  
along.

This reminds us that the Lord is present in our daily lives – in simple moments, in our work,  
and in our relationships. We may not always notice Him, especially when we are worried or  
tired, but He is there, guiding us gently. Jesus asks Peter, “Do you love me?” It is a simple  
but important question. He asks the same of us. Our faith is not about having all the  
answers,

But about loving and caring for one another. As we continue through Easter, may we keep  
our hearts open. Let us look for Christ in the ordinary and respond with love in the small  
Things we do each day.
