**A NOTE FROM FR. JIM.....**

This weekend we celebrate the beautiful Feast of the Holy Trinity. The image in our newsletter — a husband and wife holding hands with the tiny feet of their baby between them — reflects something of the very nature of God Himself. Jesus reveals to us that "God is love." For love to exist, there is the lover, the beloved, and the love shared between them. So it is with God: the Father is the Lover, the Son the Beloved, and the Holy Spirit the Love between them. The Trinity reminds us that true unity does not erase difference. In God there is distinction, yet perfect equality and dignity. Every person therefore possesses equal dignity because each is created in the image and likeness of God. So the essential aspects of this beautiful feast day. 1. Knowing that we're made in the image and likeness of God who is love means by coming to know who God is helps us come to know who we are ourselves, and 2. In a world that abandons the Christian understanding of the Triune God — three distinct Persons sharing one divine nature — we see increasing division and inequality. May this Feast of the Holy Trinity draw us deeper into the mystery of God's love, and may our families, parish, and community reflect that divine communion.
