A NOTE FROM FR. JIM.....

I once read about a distinguished man who visited a spiritual master, seeking enlightenment. As he spoke proudly about his achievements, the master quietly poured tea into a cup. Even after it was full, he kept pouring until it overflowed. The visitor protested, "Stop! The cup is full." The master replied, "Like this cup, you are overflowing with your own opinions and achievements. How can I teach you anything unless you first empty your cup?" The story leaves us with three questions: **How full is my own cup? How full of myself am I? Is there room for God in my heart?** Henri Nouwen once told fellow priests, *"If you've come here today expecting nothing to happen to you, I promise you, you won't go away disappointed—because nothing will happen to you."* When we come to Holy Mass, do we expect God to speak to us and change us, or do we simply come out of habit? Let us come like a hungry child, aware of our need and trusting in God's generosity. May we come to the Eucharist with open hearts, allowing the Lord to fill us with the grace only He can give.
