### **A NOTE FROM FR. JIM.....**

This weekend's Gospel is the Parable of the Two Sons. A father asks both sons to go and work in his vineyard. One says, "No," but later changes his mind and goes. The other says, "Yes, sir," but never goes. Jesus asks: Which one actually did the father's will? The answer is obvious — the one who eventually went. In Cork we have what I like to call a few "Corkisms." If you asked someone to do something and they had absolutely no intention of doing it, they might answer: "I will, yeah!" Translated into ordinary English, that means: "No chance. I'm not doing it! It seems the second son is a bit like a Cork man in that. He says all the right things, "Yes, sir" but his actions tell a different story. And that is the challenge of this weekend's Gospel.

It is not enough to be Christian in name only. It is not simply what we profess or what we say that matters; it is how we live. So perhaps we might ask ourselves this weekend: Would people know that I am a Christian by the way I behave? Does the way I speak, treat people, forgive, show kindness, live out the commandments and respond to those in need reflect Christ? Or am I simply reflecting the ways of the world around me? Ultimately, the Christian life is about becoming more like the REAL Jesus — not the Jesus we might create in our own image, or the one who suits our own chosen lifestyle, but Jesus as he truly reveals himself to us in the Gospel. Our words matter, but our lives must back them up. It is easy to say, "Yes, Lord." The real question is: Maybe I can talk the talk but can I walk the walk?
