Season of Creation 2026: The Season of Creation is celebrated each year from 1 September
and continues until 4th October, the Feast of St Francis of Assisi. This year's theme is
"Living Water", inspired by the prophet Ezekiel's beautiful vision of a live-giving river
flowing from the Temple. "Wherever the river flows, every living creature shall live."

Ezekiel 47:9 In Ezekiel's vision, the river begins as a small stream but grows deeper as it
flows. It brings life to barren places, heals damaged waters and allows trees and plants to
flourish. It is a powerful vision of hope, healing and renewal. All are invited to participate in
